Notes

- Translated "first", "second", "third", etc.
- Forms ending in -ēnsimus can also be written without the "n". For example, "vīcēsimus" = "vīcēnsimus".
- Ordinal numerals are adjectives that are declined like 1st/2nd declension adjectives.
- Two-word numbers from 21 to 99 can be written in two ways: vīcēsimus pīmus = pīmus et vīcēnsimus
- Thousands from 2,000 and up are expressed with "mīllēnsimus" and an adverb numeral: 2,000 = bis mīllēnsimus = twice thousandth
